From 1976 to 1986, photographer Gary Green lived in New York City, where he studied photography and worked as a photographer's assistant by day and spent his nights at CBGB's and Max's Kansas City—among other important venues—photographing the performers, the artists, and their fans. The photographs were published recently in the book *When Midnight Comes Around*, which is now sold out from the publisher, Stanley/Barker. The photographs were also shown in 2021 at Galerie Miranda in Paris. This is the first time the work is being shown in Portland.

Gary Green is a Professor of Art at Colby College, where he has taught photography and run the photography program since 2007. He received his MFA from the Milton Avery Graduate School of the Arts at Bard College. Green's work is held in many collections including those of the Rhode Island School of Design Museum in Providence; the Portland Art Museum in Portland, Oregon; the Amon Carter Museum in Fort Worth, Texas; and in Maine at the Portland Museum of Art, and the Bowdoin, Bates, and Colby College museums of art. His books are in collections at the Yale Beinecke Library, New York's MoMA Artist Book Collection, Bowdoin College Special Collections, among others.
